

Frequently Asked Questions

- ? **Can I enroll in school without a parent or guardian?**
 A Yes. If you are an unaccompanied youth, we can assist with school enrollment and placement options. You can also enroll with the assistance of an adult, over the age of 18.
- ? **I have changed schools a lot and don't know where to find my records. Who can help me?**
 A We can help get copies of your previous grades/transcripts, immunization/health records, and IEP (if applicable).
- ? **Which school can I go to?**
 A You can go to the school you attended before you became homeless or the school in the area where you are living. We can help you to consider options.
- ? **Can I get kicked out of school because I don't have a permanent address?**
 A No. If your living situation qualifies as homeless, you have the right to remain at your current school. If you have questions, contact our office
- ? **If I live on my own and take care of myself, am I emancipated?**
 A No. Emancipation means that you are legally separated from your parents or guardian and they are no longer obligated to support you. You must be found eligible and complete legal paperwork.
- ? **Can you help me if I am undocumented?**
 A Yes! Your immigration status does not affect your right to attend school. You have the same rights as any other student.

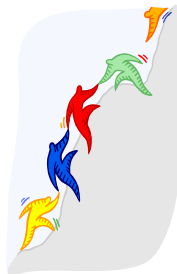

- With friends or relatives (Couch- surfing)
- Forced out or told to leave home
- Runaway
- Abandoned
- A place not intended for a person to sleep
- Hotel or motel
- Shelter or transitional housing program
- Abandoned building
