Frequently Asked Questions

Can I enroll in School without a parent or guardian?

Yes. If you are an unaccompanied youth, we can assist with school enrollment and placement options. You can also enroll with the assistance of an adult, over the age of 18.

I have changed schools a lot and don't know where to find my records. Who can

We can help get copies of your previous grades/transcripts, immunization/health records, and IEP (if applicable)

Which school can I go to?

You can go to the school you attended before you became homeless or the school in the area where you are living. We can help you to consider options.

Can I get kicked out of school because I don't have a permanent address?

No. If your living situation qualifies as homeless, you have the right to remain at your current school. If you have questions, contact our office

If I live on my own and take care of myself, am I emancipated?

No. Emancipation means that you are legally separated from your parents of guardian and they are no longer obligated to support you. You must be found eligible and complete legal paperwork.

Can you help me if I am undocumented?

Yes! Your immigration status does not affect your right to attend school. You have the same rights as any other student.
